Kase Nikkei Community Scholarship Program

The Kase Nikkei Community Scholarship Program (Kase Program) will offer Nikkei students the opportunity to financially support their education and the work of a non-profit community organization while developing career and life-skills to increase their future employability. It will also increase their understanding of and provide the necessary tools to help address contemporary issues affecting San Francisco's Japantown. Coordinated by the Japanese Cultural and Community Center of Northern California (the Center/JCCCNC), the goal of the program is to support the development of the next generation of community leaders

Starting in June, participants in the Kase Program will take part in an eleven-week (full-time, including some weekend days) community internship at the Center, a non-profit organization in San Francisco's Japantown.

Up to five (5) \$5,000 scholarships will be awarded to selected applicants who successfully complete the Kase Nikkei Community Scholarship Program. Students will be selected based on their application, letter of recommendation and interview.

Important Dates and Information

1. **The 2019 Kase Nikkei Community Scholarship Program is an eleven-week commitment that will provide valuable experience in leadership development, non-profit work and community organizing, as well as develop skills related to the individual's career interest. Participants must be available full-time (and some weekends) for the Program from June 12-August 23, 2019.**
2. **Japanese ancestry is not a requirement but a significant background of involvement in the Japanese American community is required for participation in the Kase Program, as well as a strong desire to learn about Japanese/Japanese American culture, heritage and our San Francisco Japantown community.**
3. **To be eligible for the 2019 Program, the applicant must be continuing, during the fall of 2019, or recently graduated from college and be 18 years old at the start of the program (birth date on or before June 1, 2001).**
4. **Applications are DUE on Sunday, April 14, 2019.**
 - a. **The Kase Program application process is a two-step process. After the initial applications have been submitted, qualified applicants will be invited to a personal interview and participants will be selected by April 30, 2019.**
