Kase Nikkei Community Scholarship Program

The Kase Nikkei Community Scholarship Program (Kase Program) will offer Nikkei students a financial scholarship for their education and an opportunity to support the work of a nonprofit community organization while developing their career and life-skills to increase their future employability. The program will enhance their understanding of and provide the necessary tools to address contemporary issues affecting San Francisco's Japantown. Coordinated by the Japanese Cultural and Community Center of Northern California (the Center/JCCCNC), the program's goal is to develop the next generation of community leaders.

Participants in the Kase Program will take part in an eleven-week, full-time (including some weekend days) internship at the Center, a nonprofit organization in Japantown that has been working to promote and preserve Japanese American culture, heritage and the community for over 48 years.

We will award up to five (5) \$5,000 scholarships for selected applicants who successfully complete the Kase Nikkei Community Scholarship Program. Participants are chosen based on their application, letter of recommendation and interview.

Important Dates and Information

- 1. The 2021 Kase Nikkei Community Scholarship Program is an eleven-week commitment that will provide valuable nonprofit, community organizing and leadership development experience and develop entry-level work skills and those related to the individual's career interest. Participants must be available full-time (and some weekends) for the Program from June 10-August 20, 2021.**
- 2. Japanese ancestry is not a requirement, but significant participation and involvement in the Japanese American community are required for participation in the Kase Program and a strong desire to learn about Japanese/Japanese American culture, heritage, and our San Francisco Japantown community.**
- 3. Applicants must be continuing their education during the fall of 2021 or have recently graduated from college. Participants must be at least 18 years old at the start of the program (birth date on or before June 1, 2003).**
- 4. Applications are DUE by Friday, April 23, 2021.**
 - a. The Kase Program application process is a two-step process. After the initial applications have been received, qualified applicants will be invited to a personal interview, and then participants will be selected by May 7, 2021.**
